As the Christian population struggles to survive in a volatile political environment of ethnic distrust, the Franciscan Foundation for the Holy Land uses every available resource to help the poor and unemployed meet their basic needs.

These programs wouldn't be possible without the many faithful donors who generously contribute to FFHL. These gifts continue to bless the "living stones" by funding education, providing subsidized housing and offering sustainable employment. 

Life Estate Reserved – You transfer your personal residence or farm to FFHL and retain the right to use the property for your lifetime. *Benefits:* You want to remain living in your home and want a current income tax deduction.

Charitable Gift Annuity – You make a gift of cash or property to FFHL and we agree to make fixed payments for one or two lives. *Benefits:* You want to make a gift to FFHL and receive fixed income for the future. This plan works well with your gift of cash or appreciated stock that is providing little or no income.

A PILGRIMAGE TO REMEMBER: AN INTERVIEW WITH PILGRIM LISA RYAN

Lisa Ryan shares how her experience with a Franciscan Foundation for the Holy Land pilgrimage led to her decision to support a young Christian student's education; how that relationship has been a mutual blessing and why the identity of her pilgrimage tour bus driver left her speechless.

When did you first become involved with FFHL?

In 2019, I had the opportunity to join Fr. Peter on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. From the moment we landed in Israel, he encouraged us to ask ourselves why we were there, what we needed and what did God want us to do. His words became my prayer for the entire pilgrimage.

During one of our evening talks, Fr. Peter spoke about the struggles faced by Arab Christians in the Holy Land who have limited opportunities to find meaningful work and support their families. He introduced us to several young people who had received college scholarships from FFHL, which had significantly changed their lives. Our group was deeply moved by their stories, and we decided to collectively sponsor two college scholarships.

That pilgrimage was a life-changing experience, and I felt a strong desire to return the following year. I made another trip to the Holy Land with Fr. Peter's group in the spring of 2020, during which I committed to personally sponsoring a university scholarship. I requested to sponsor a young woman and FFHL matched me with Nataly Boutros, a student studying accounting and law at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem.

Tell us about the student you're sponsoring.

Nataly and I began corresponding via email during her first semester of college, and I was delighted to get to know her better. From our conversations, I gained a greater appreciation for the challenges faced by Christians in the Holy Land.

In early 2022, I returned to the Holy Land. I knew that Nataly lived with her family in the Old City of Jerusalem, and I emailed her letting her know where I would be staying. I was expecting just a short visit at our hotel with her as I assumed she would have very little free time from her studies. While still in the Sea of Galilee area, our tour bus driver named Jiries quietly told me, "Nataly says hello." I asked him if he was a relative and he replied, "I am her father." And with that unbelievable coincidence, we were able to arrange for Nataly to join our group while we visited the Dead Sea area. Imagine the time we had to talk and learn about each other on the bus rides to and from Jerusalem.

What does it mean to you to support the University Scholarship program?

Supporting university scholarships through FFHL has been a rewarding experience for me. Fr. Peter's passionate advocacy to help Christian families stay in the Holy Land has made a deep impression on all of us. I am grateful for the opportunity to help and to get to know one of these families personally. FFHL offers a variety of programs to support children, young adults, and families, and I encourage others to consider getting involved in this mission.


