### The Holy Land Crisis

Conflict is the story of the Holy Land where for centuries, faith, history and possession of land collide.



The COVID-19 pandemic and the ongoing conflict have severely impacted the Holy Land's tourism industry, a key source of income for thousands of Christians. For the first time in 1,600 years, pilgrims were absent, resulting in economic losses estimated at \$320 million – the equivalent of all wages in the tourism sector.

The situation remains fragile, with increased violence and restrictions limiting access to work, education and healthcare for hundreds of thousands of Holy Land Christians. Both sides continue to endure significant suffering, and the need for resources and support is critical.



Christians, now a small minority, are disappearing from the region. Economic and political pressures force many to leave. In 1940, Jerusalem had 45,000 Christians; today, fewer than 10,000 remain. Christians now account for less than 2% of the Holy Land's population.



### Franciscan Response

The Franciscans are committed to serving Christians in the Holy Land. In 1342, Pope Clement VI tasked the Franciscans with caring for the holy sites of Christendom and ministering to the faithful in the Holy Land.

Today, the Franciscan Custody of the Holy Land plays a significant role in supporting the Christian community, providing for the ordinary necessities of life – food, clothing, work and education.

As custodians of Christian hope, the friars preach in word and action peace, love, mercy and forgiveness to a people struggling, to those forced from their homes, to a world in crisis, void of security.



### What FFHL Supports



Since 1997, FFHL has awarded hundreds of university scholarships to marginalized Christian students who are now doctors, nurses, lawyers and architects. With a higher education, students are more likely to secure employment and remain in their homeland.



FFHL supports elementary and high school programs with annual grants. Our schools teach the importance of family and community, help those in need and welcome newcomers. We provide a Christian education that addresses global issues like poverty and social injustice, guiding students to make positive choices for peace, solidarity and development.



The Magnificat Institute uses music to bring together youth from different backgrounds in the Holy Land, promoting cooperation and understanding.



FFHL offers vocational scholarships for Holy Land Christians, providing training in trades like carpentry, plumbing and mechanics, along with accredited diplomas and tailored tool kits to help students enter the workforce.



During times of crisis, FFHL serves the community by delivering the essentials such as food, water and medicine to those unable to access these items. In addition to counseling, medical support and social activities, FFHL provides summer camps, marriage preparation and prayer support to help Holy Land Christians overcome challenges and improve their quality of life.



During reconstructive work on the floor of the Shrine of the Holy Sepulchre, FFHL supporters provided funding for the important archaeological works around the tomb of Jesus.
