POPE LEO XIV, ONE OF US

A REFLECTION BY FR. JOHN PUODZIUNAS, O.F.M. ON THE ELECTION OF POPE LEO XIV

rom that first announcement, *habemus papam*, Americans in particular, have been trying to identify their connection with Pope Leo XIV, the unexpected choice of the Cardinals ... confirming that we want to feel closer than the six degrees of separation that connect each of us. My connection? We did our theological studies at the same theology school in Chicago, the Catholic Theological Union in Hyde Park. Pope Leo XIV completed his studies as I began my studies. We walked the same corridors, sat in the same classrooms, prayed in the same chapel, pondered academic works in the same library and were inspired by the same teachers. That seems close enough to claim a connection.

My initial impression is that Pope Leo XIV is a man who first reflects in actions and appearance what he believes, namely that as successor of Peter, he is called to serve and lead Catholics of all cultures to embrace the person of Jesus Christ as redeemer, and that the church in this embrace of the message, in a living and recognizable tradition, through integrity of its words, actions and deeds transforms the world. Then we know God's love. Then we realize peace. While many people are looking for a political ideology in Pope Leo, he proclaims first and foremost, the Gospel. From the Gospel, the message transcends personal opinion, academic ideas and political ideologies.

What does this mean for the Franciscan Foundation for the Holy Land and its mission of safeguarding the Christian presence in the Holy Land? In addressing pilgrims for the Jubilee of Oriental Churches, Pope Leo called for an immediate end to conflicts raging around the world, including in the Holy Land, and he encouraged Christians in the Holy Land to remain firm in their faith and to remain in their homeland. The Foundation and the Holy Father speak a common message, rooted in Jesus Christ, we serve the vulnerable, we safeguard their presence in their homeland...we have a persuasive partner.

We wish Pope Leo well, we wish him God's blessing as he embarks on this new journey as Bishop of Rome, Vicar of Christ, Successor of St. Peter...as Pope Leo XIV.

NEW CUSTOS OF THE HOLY LAND

It is with great joy and profound hope that we announce that on June 24, on this Solemnity of the Birth of John the Baptist, our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV has confirmed the election of our Brother, Fr. Francesco lelpo, O.F.M. as Custos of the Holy Land and Guardian of Mount Zion.

ANNOUNCEMENT FROM THE VATICAN

Br. Francesco lelpo, an Italian national, was born in Lauria (PZ) on May 18, 1970. He professed his solemn vows in 1998 and was ordained to the priesthood in 2000. From 1994 to 2010, he served as a religious education teacher and, since 2000, as Rector of the Franciscanum Luzzago Institute in Brescia. Between 2006 and 2010, he was a member of the National Council of FIDAE (Federation of Educational Activity Institutes), and from 2007 to 2010, served as Provincial Definitor of the Lombard Province. From 2010 to 2013, he ministered as parish priest of the Franciscan Parish of Saint Anthony of Padua in Varese. In September 2013, he was appointed Commissioner of the Holy Land for Lombardy, with his mandate extended in 2016 to include the entire Province of Northern Italy. Since 2014, he has served on the Board of Directors of the Pro Terra Sancta Association. Since 2022, he has also held the role of President of the Holy Land Foundation, while simultaneously serving as Delegate of the Custos of the Holy Land for Italy.

We look forward to welcoming Fr. Francesco as Chairman of the Franciscan Foundation for the Holy Land and for our sharing in the common mission of safeguarding the Christian presence in the Holy Land. Let us pray for Fr. Francesco as he takes on this new position.

In a statement to the Vatican media, Fr. lelpo emphasised how "the service that the Order and the Church have asked of me immediately made me realize the enormous disproportion between my humble self and the duty required of me, particularly at this moment in history. So, as on the day of my religious profession, I entrust myself to God, to the Church, to my Order and to my brothers!"

John Puodziunas, President

INVEST IN FAITH AND EDUCATION



What inspires someone to sponsor the education of students thousands of miles away? For Charles (Chuck) and Linda Neubecker, the answer is simple: gratitude, faith and a deep desire to give back.

Although they had supported FFHL for many years, they first began sponsoring individual students three years ago. "The first student we sponsored completed a two-year program, and now we support Celina Giacaman, a third-year nursing student at Bethlehem University."

Faith has always been central to the couple's motivation. "Our faith is integral to our support of FFHL and the other causes we support. It's important to us to invest in the next generation of Christian leaders, particularly in the Holy Land." Although they have not met Celina in person, their connection is heartfelt and sincere. "We've received messages from her, and her family even sent us a beautiful nativity set last Christmas from their shop near the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem. It's the most beautiful nativity set we've ever seen."

When asked what he would say to someone considering sponsorship, Chuck's response is clear: "Many great students need help. Sponsoring a student in the Holy Land is relatively inexpensive compared to the U.S. We need to maintain a Christian presence there. The most meaningful part is knowing we're helping deserving students who might not otherwise have the chance to attend university — equipping them for adult life and careers in the Holy Land."



It's important for people not only to take care of their families, but also to share their resources – monetary and otherwise – with those in need, especially in places facing deep hardship. As the saying goes, 'No man is an island.'

DAY OF SHRINES & WINES PILGRIMAGE

A GREAT WAY TO LEARN ABOUT FFHL

On June 5, 2025, 54 pilgrims set off on the *Day of Shrines & Wines Pilgrimage*, sponsored by the Franciscan Foundation for the Holy Land (FFHL) and Columbus' Cradling Christianity (CC). This one-day event of prayer, reflection, touring and wine tasting was the idea of a CC committee member during a brainstorming session. While CC will still host its annual event on September 4, 2025, the chance to share FFHL's mission with over 50 people through a spiritually-rich day – with a touch of fun – was too good to pass up.

The day began with a rosary led by Msgr. Stephan Moloney, Pastor of Columbus St. Andrew Church, on the motor coach, followed by a presentation titled *Relics: 6 Degrees of Separation* by Fr. John Puodziunas, President of FFHL. Upon arriving at the Shrine of Maria Stein in Maria Stein, OH, Fr. John and Msgr. Moloney celebrated Mass in the chapel. The group then enjoyed guided tours of the reliquary – home to over 1,200 relics – and the museum.

A beautiful lunch followed in the Shrine's "Upper Room," with time afterward to stroll the grounds or visit the gift shop. Later, Msgr. Moloney led the group in praying the Stations of the Cross in the outdoor gardens of the Shrine.

The group reconvened in a transformed "Upper Room," now styled as a wine tasting room, for an fun and educational presentation of four selected wines by Columbus wine expert

Dan Tarpy. Paired with charcuterie plates and lively discussion, the tasting closed out the visit, followed by a quiet coach ride back to Columbus.

It was a spiritual, educational and enjoyable day for all – deepening their connection to Cradling Christianity, FFHL, its mission and Fr. John.


